Proof of study abroad/traveler's health insurance.
Judicial Affairs Clearance Form.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDY ABROAD

Students must be currently enrolled and in good academic standing (not on academic warning, probation, suspension, or expulsion) to be eligible to participate in a study abroad program. Students in faculty-led group programs must meet the minimum GPA established by the faculty leader.

Any student who has applied and/or been accepted will automatically become ineligible if placed on any type of probation or suspension before departure.
